SCWC's Quarterly Luncheons bring together **the region's top industry leaders** to both provide SCWC members with expert commentary and analysis of our state's most pressing water issues, and offer noteworthy networking opportunities. # STORMWATER WORKSHOP

SCWC's Annual Stormwater Workshop creates a forum for cities, water agencies, regulators and regional leaders to **discuss the potential of stormwater capture projects and integrated regional water management** to expand local water supplies and help reduce reliance on imported water during the state's ongoing drought.

### WATER ENERGY WORKSHOP

Although water and energy go hand in hand, before SCWC there was no regional forum to address the two concurrently. After launching its new Water Energy Task Force, SCWC had a full house at its inaugural Water Energy Workshop – "The Nexus Between Water and Energy" – earlier this spring. Chair of the California Air Resources Board Mary Nichols served as keynote speaker and was joined by a panel of regional influencers and experts.

# **LAWN DUDE COMES OUT SWINGING IN 2016 (AGAIN)**

At the height of California's worst drought in decades, water agencies took extraordinary measures to promote conservation and launched the nation's largest rebate and turf removal programs. To spur action and support its members, SCWC partnered with Clear Channel Outdoor Americas in 2014 to launch a drought and conservation awareness advertising campaign... and Lawn Dude was born.

Spunky, water-saving character Lawn Dude entered the 2016 political season swinging with his fourth, election-themed, digital billboard campaign "up in lights" throughout Southern California. Lawn Dude unveiled his timely campaign pledge to "Conserve, Conserve, Conserve!" during the State Water Resources Control Board's May 2016 meeting to consider the adoption of continued emergency statewide drought regulations.
