

## New Season Same Drought



Fall has ended and winter has arrived. The hot summer months may be over, but the drought conditions and water supply shortages are not. Customer cooperation and water conservation throughout the summer helped **to preserve water supplies for the future**. Even with the recent rainfall, Santa Ynez, and nearly every part of the State, is dealing with an unprecedented drought and tough new water quality restrictions that have significantly reduced available water supplies.

Under these circumstances, ID No.1 customers have shown a commitment to conservation, responding to the District's Stage 1 Water Supply Shortage declared in June to cut back and substantially reduce water use by 20%.
